Physical Development:

- Developing pencil control through a variety of activities, such as writing own name, dot to dot activities, tracing pictures and words.
- Moving around safely using different parts of the body and developing awareness of space.
- Learning to use small tools effectively e.g. scissors, play dough tools.

Expressive Arts and Design:

- Develop use of imaginative and expressive language through role-play.
- Exploring pattern and texture using printing techniques.
- Singing a range of songs and nursery rhymes with confidence and d enthusiasm.
- Moving expressively to different types of music.

Ways to help your child at home

- Practise washing hands and cleanliness
- Develop independence skills, dressing and undressing.
- Support with toileting and being more independent.
- Singing familiar songs and nursery rhymes.
- Share a different book each night before bed (fiction and non fiction).
- Counting out items when shopping.
- Make small piles of items for counting.
- Practice writing name with letters formed in the correct direction.
- Identify sounds learnt using magnetic letters
- Drawing, writing and cutting activities
- Collect natural materials from walks in the local environment
- Complete sound practice sheets (this will be sent home on Fridays).


