School Records

Summer Uniform

Please may I remind everyone of the correct summer uniform to enable us to maintain our high standards in this area:

Blue and white summer dresses (checked or striped) or white short sleeved polo shirt with grey school skirt, grey shorts or trousers. Blue school sweatshirt/ cardigan. Blue tank tops with the school logo can also be worn instead of the school sweat shirt/cardigan if you prefer.

Patterned/coloured tights/socks are not to be worn. The correct colours are white, navy or grey.

Shoes are also important consideration at this time of year. Sensible school shoes must continue to be worn. Unsuitable sandals including ‘lightweight open toed jelly shoes/ crocs/ flip flops’ are inappropriate for school and extremely dangerous in the playground. Trainers/boots are also not permitted.

May I also remind all parents that children should **not wear any jewellery to school** (including watches and earrings). Nail varnish/temporary tattoos are also not allowed to be worn at school.

I would also like to take this opportunity to remind you that extreme and inappropriate hairstyles/ haircuts, e.g. shaven heads, part shaven/patterned heads or Mohicans/spiky hair are not allowed, as they are inappropriate for young school children Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.
