Sometimes a bag of food, a hot bowl of soup or a chance to get clean, can make an enormous difference. If food and other items are available on the premises, then it can help the young person's crisis. As a guideline, we have found it helpful in previous years if different classes collect particular items and would like your help to collect the following:

F2 and Pre School: Hot Chocolate/ Biscuits/ Pot Noodles (Chicken & mushroom or curry are favourites)

Year 1: Tinned sausage & beans/ curry/ meatballs/ spaghetti bolognese/soup

Year 2: Toiletries eg Soap/ shower gel/ shampoo/ toothpaste & toothbrushes/ shaving foam/ deodorant
